From JR The Chūō Line, “Musashi-Koganei Station” (North Exit)

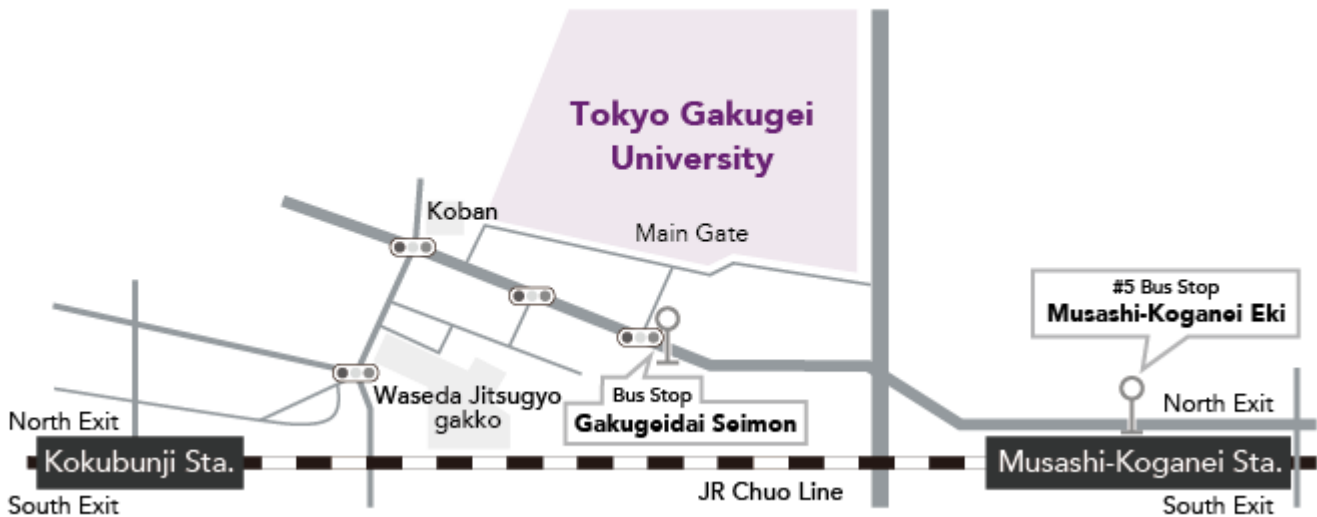
Approx. 25 minutes on foot from the station.
